Overview

Architecture creates connections from generation to generation. Throughout our history, whether it is the natural motifs and references of yesteryear or today's L.E.E.D. certified municipal buildings, Seattle has set a standard of design that responds to our natural environment. Participants will learn about Seattle's history and use "telescopes" to identify PNW influences in downtown architecture.

Big Idea

- Seattle architecture relates to local surroundings, the community and the Northwest.

Outcomes

- Participants will understand architecture differently than before and to describe what they are seeing and how they react to it.
- Participants will recognize the significant impact the natural environment of the Pacific Northwest has had on designers in this region.
